I have served on the Houston High-Speed Rail Watch organization for the past three years advocating for an appropriate route for the Texas Central Partners high-speed rail project and the preferred location of the Houston terminus to serve as a multi-modal transportation hub in the NW part of Houston. For the past several years, I have worked to improve my community, including transportation issues in Houston, by serving on the boards of directors of the Forrest Lake Townhouse Association and the Greater Inwood Partnership, and reinvigorating the Super Neighborhood 5 Council and serving as its president. I also serve on the Houston-Galveston Area Council High Capacity Transit Taskforce and the transportation committee of the Super Neighborhood Alliance.
